The OT will also team with the Centre's Physiotherapist to provide services for school-age children eligible for support under the School-Age Therapy program. This position involves working in community-based settings with a dynamic team of families, childcare providers, and allied professionals dedicated to providing the highest standard of integrated family-centered service.
